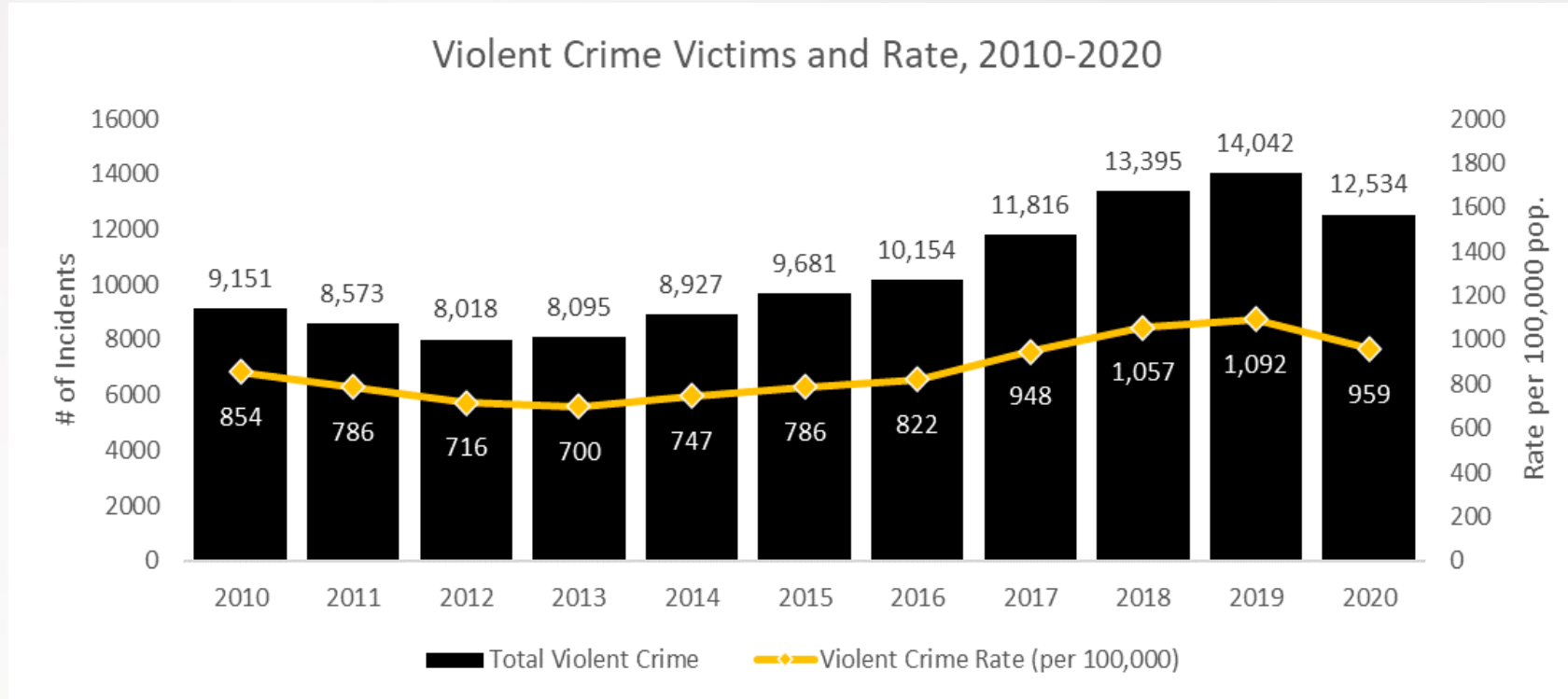

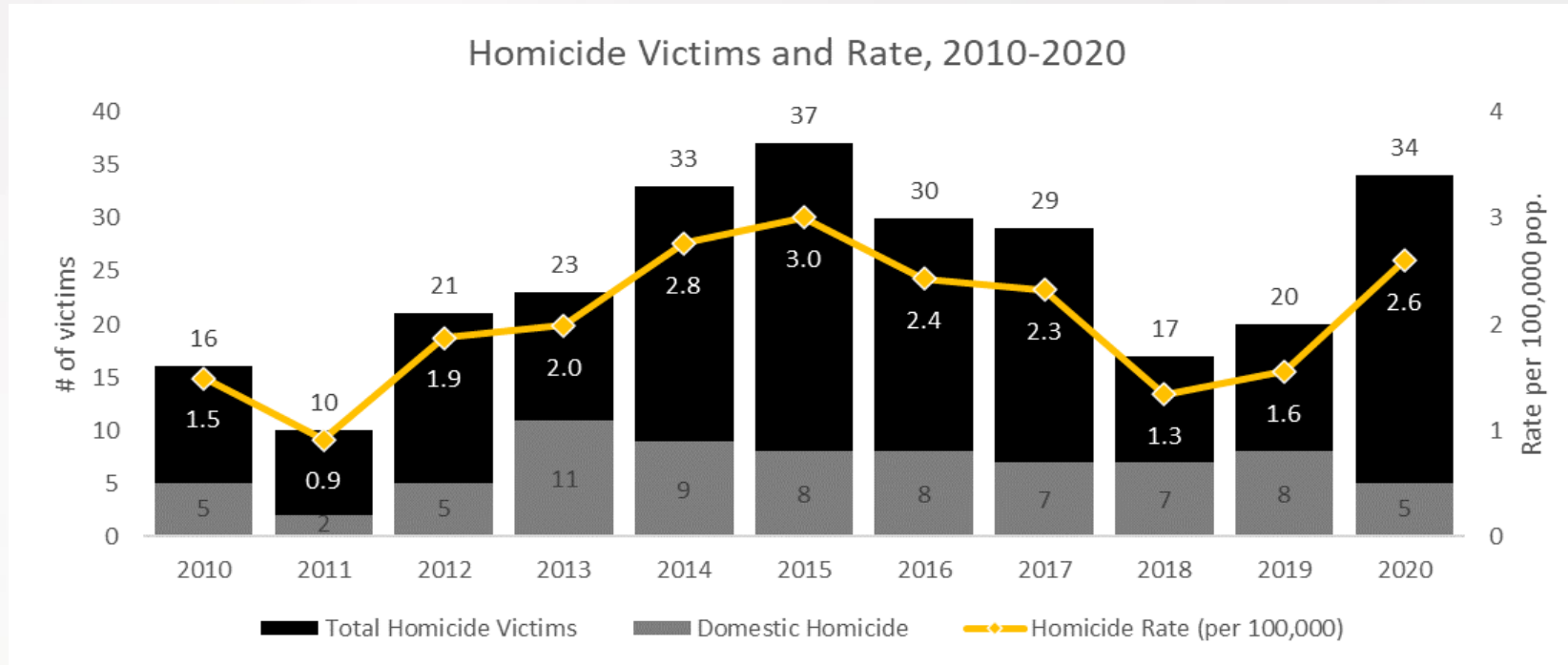

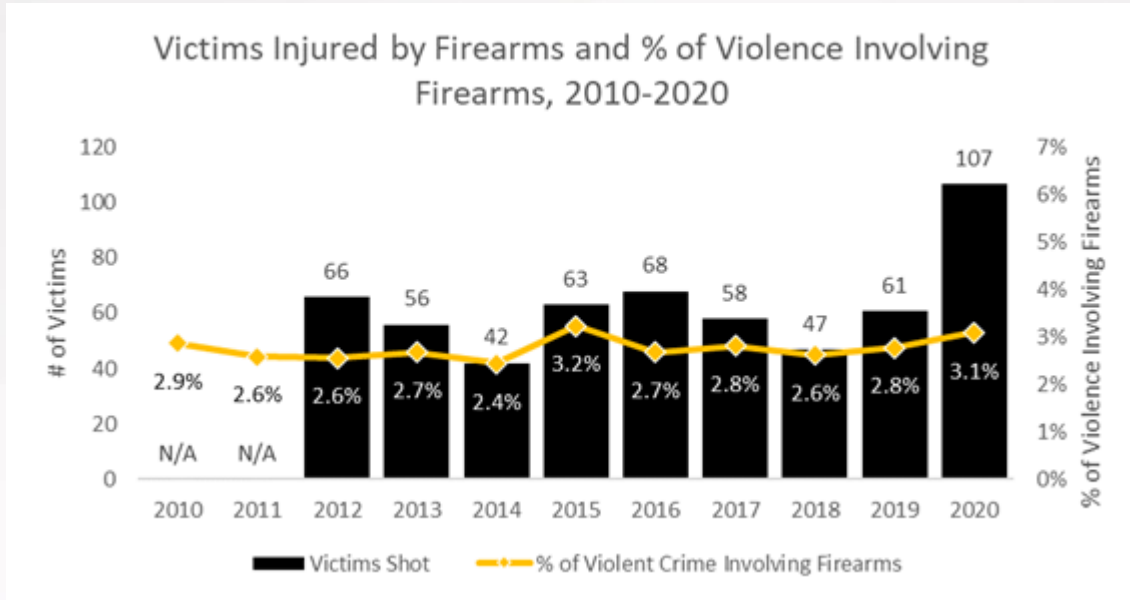

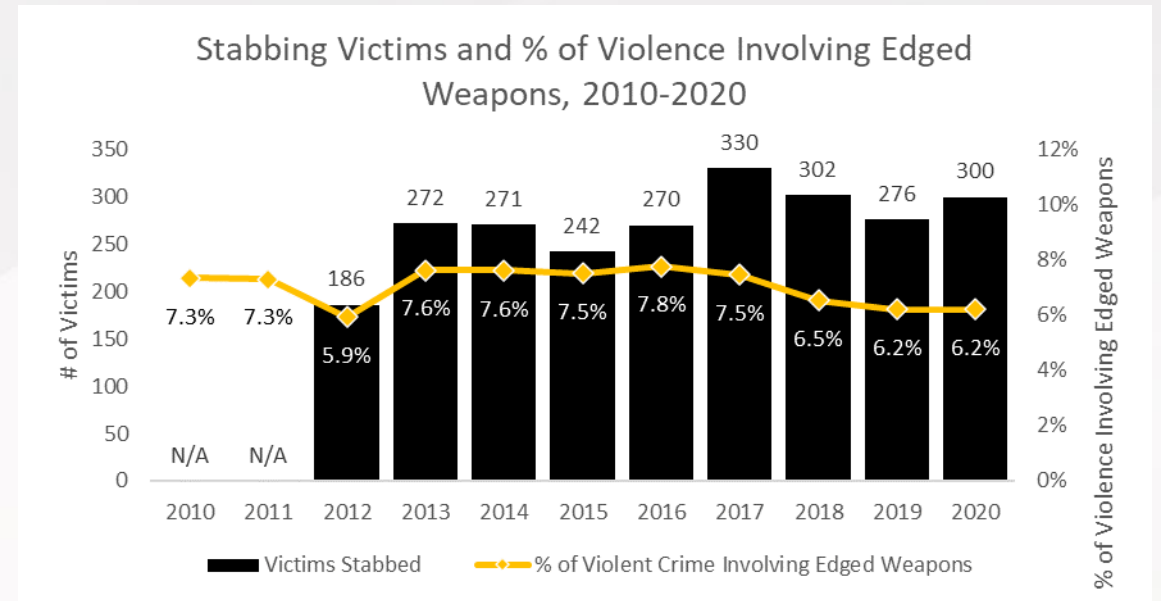

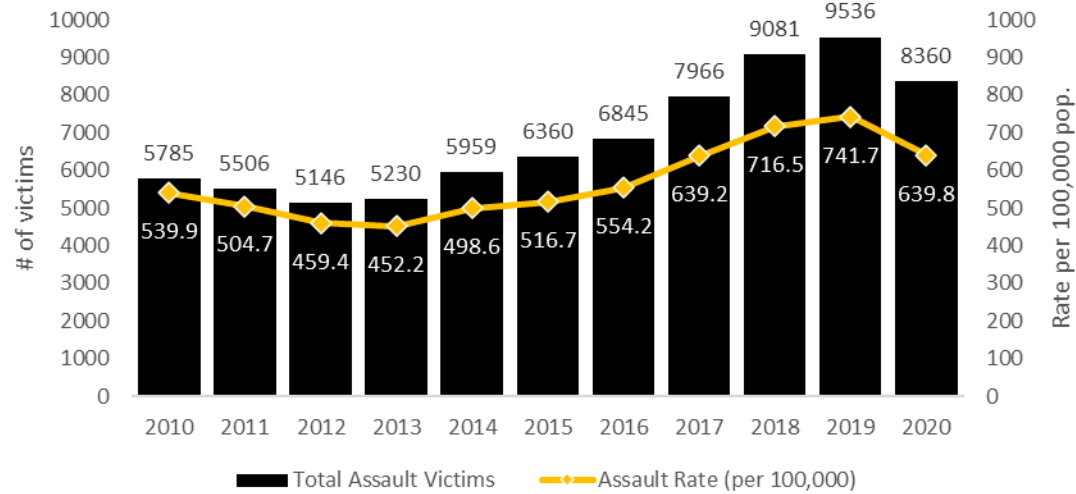

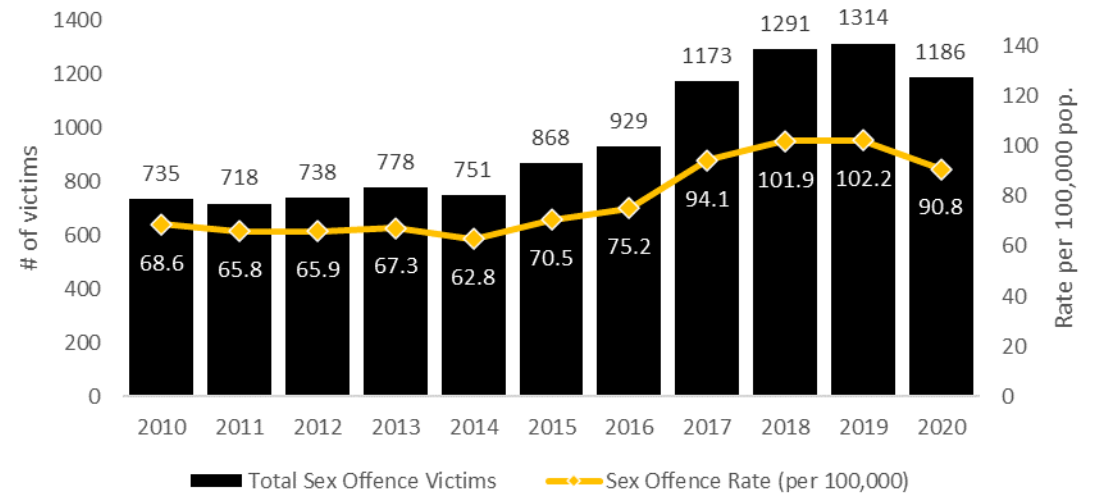

Assault Victims and Rate, 2010-2020



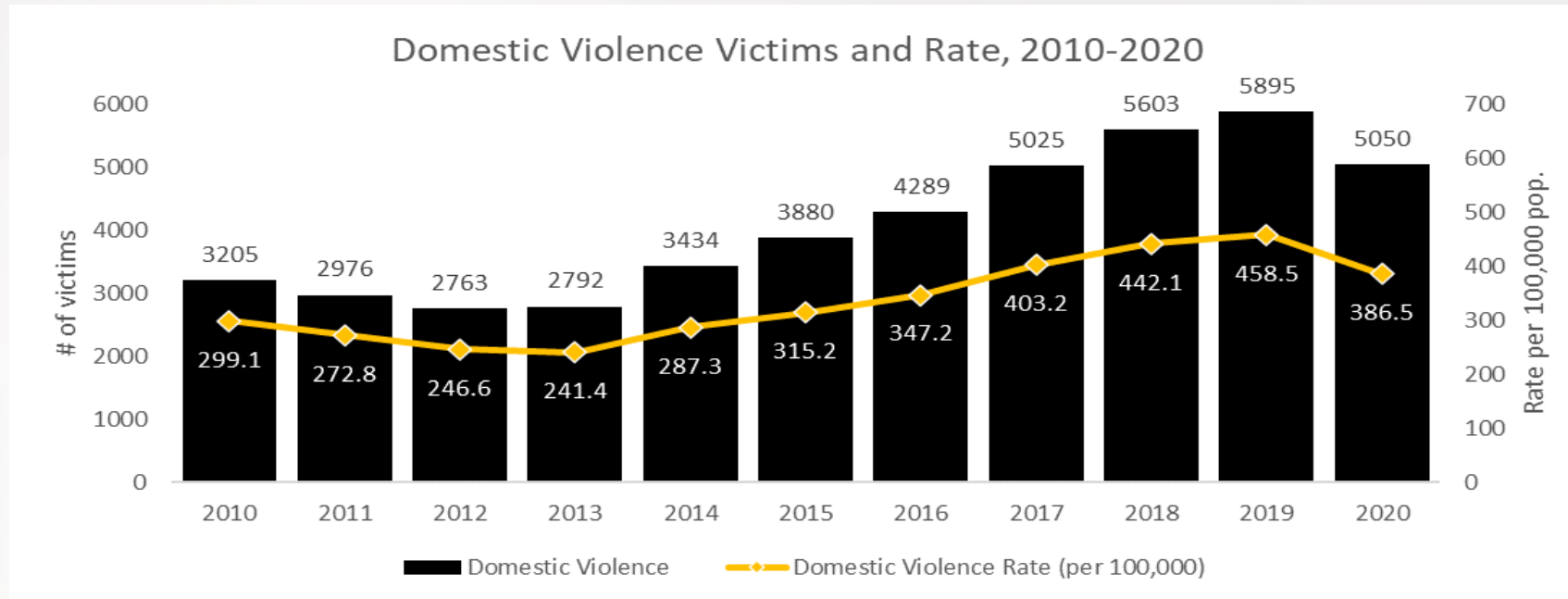
Sex Assault Victims and Rate, 2010-2020

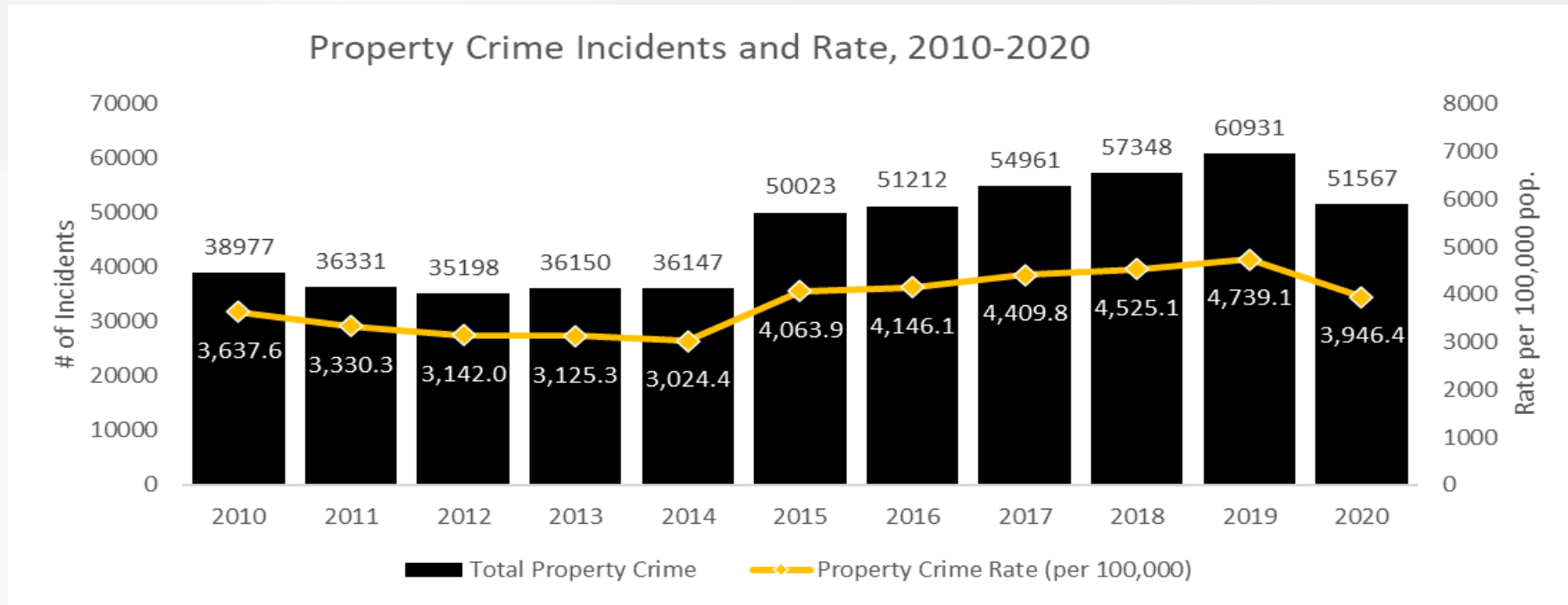

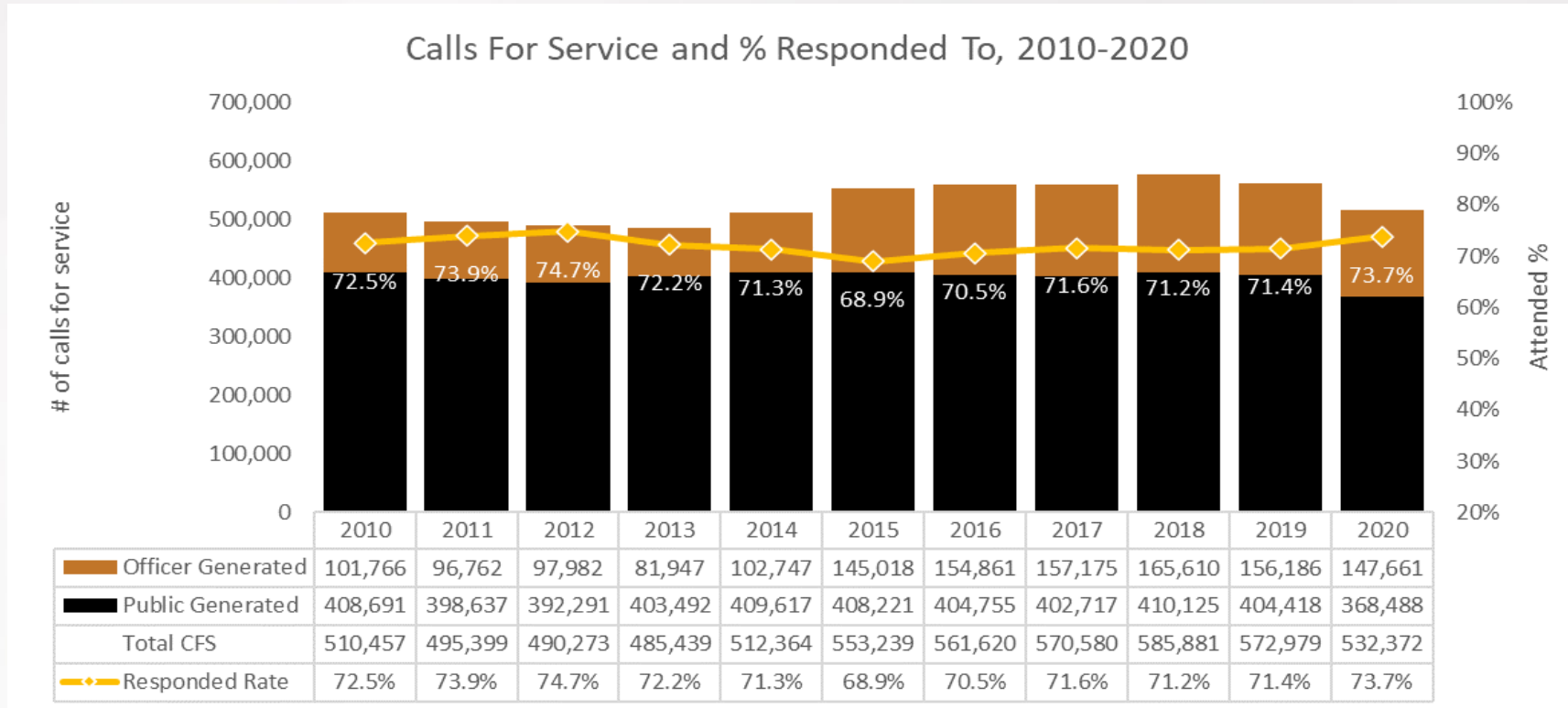

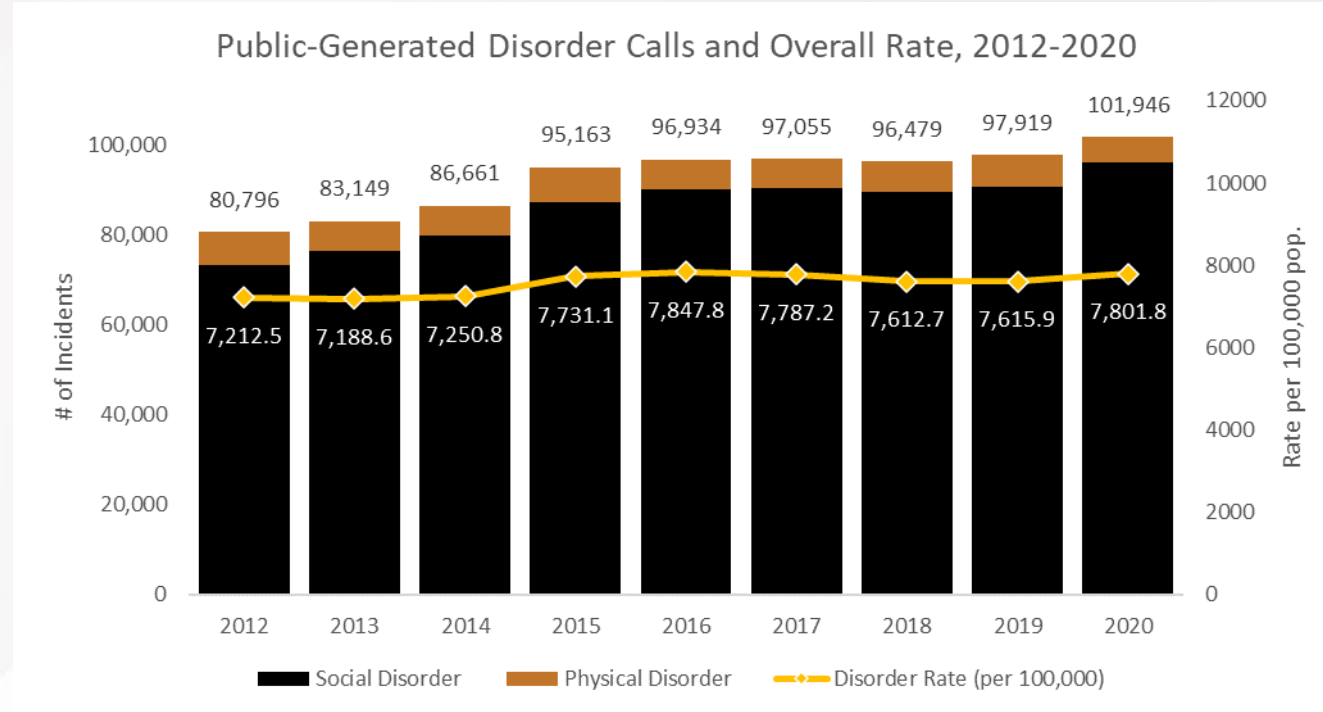

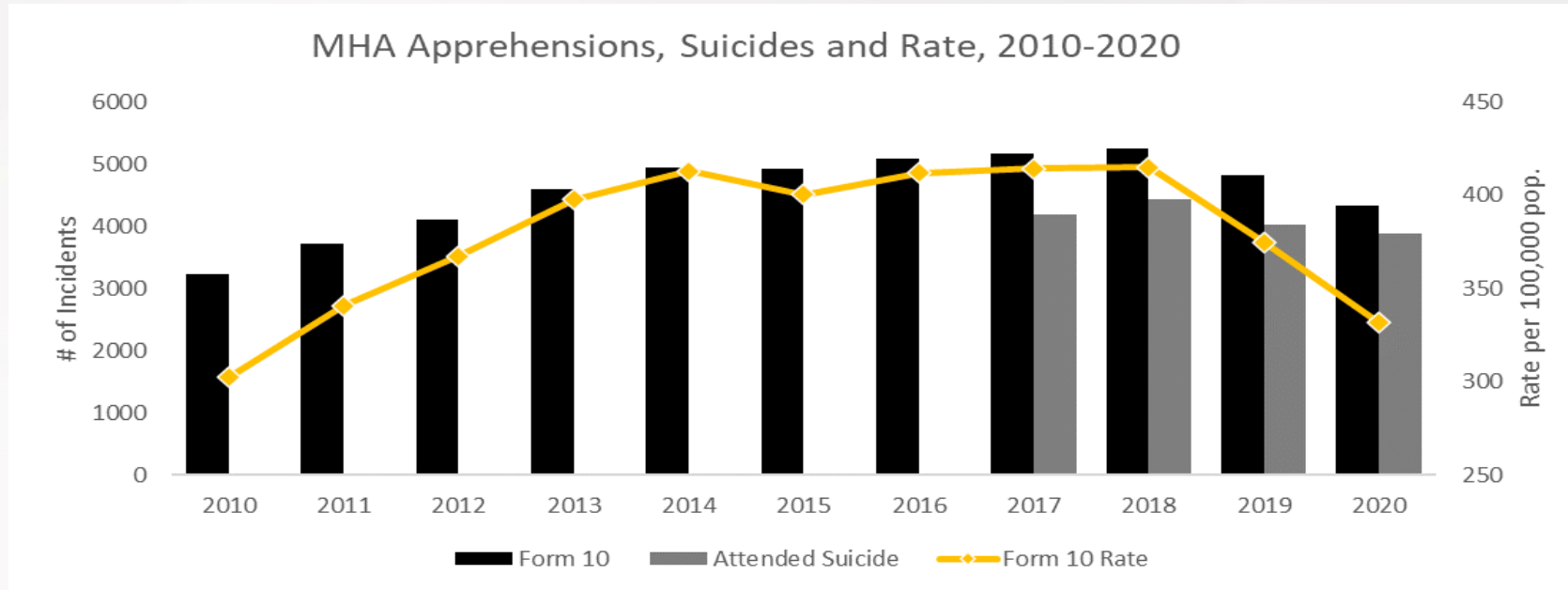

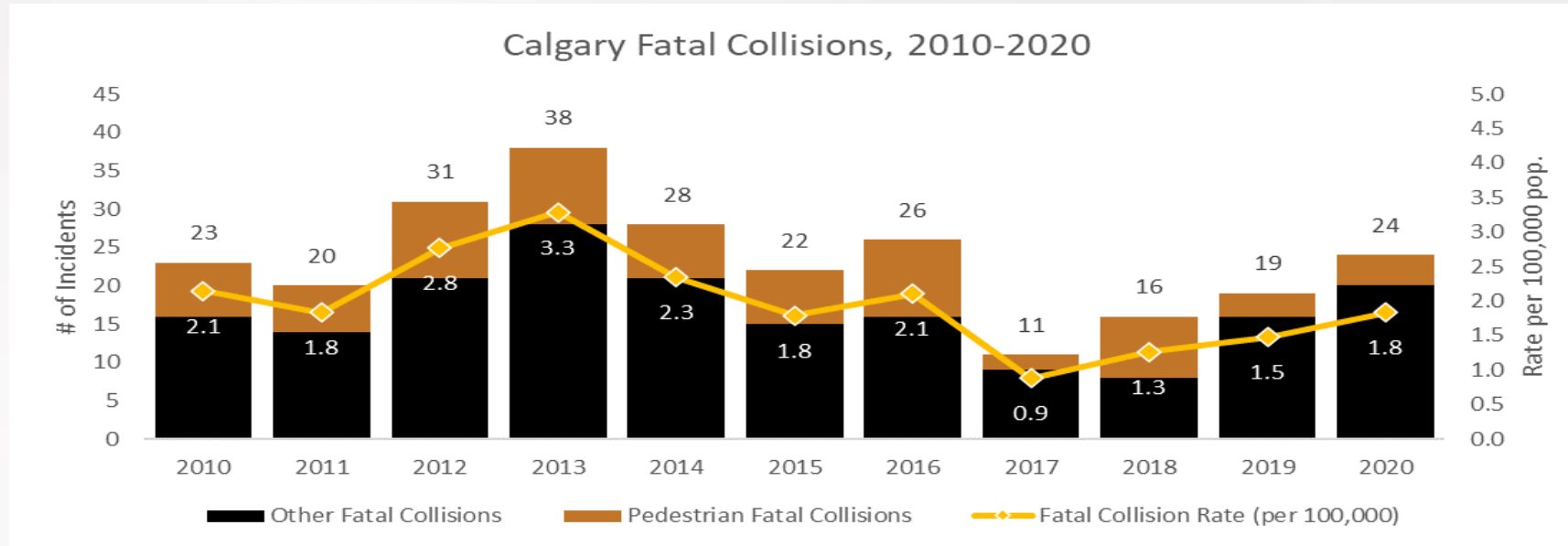

Looking Forward

Beyond the immediate impact, property crime can be expected to rebound when the restrictive measures that were the immediate cause of the observed decrease in criminal activity have been lifted or removed. Criminological theory suggests that some forms of crime could even increase beyond their pre-pandemic level as a result of the additional economic strain caused by COVID-19.

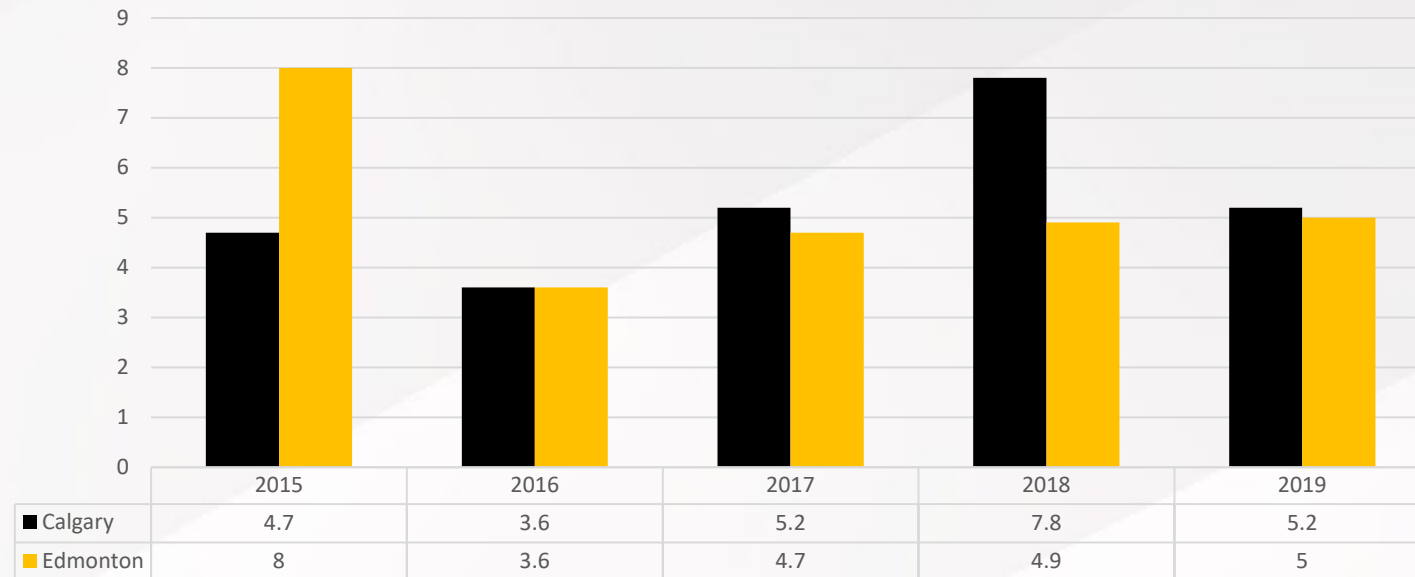
