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# The Calgary Stampede 2023

## Introduction:

- The 2023 Calgary Stampede will run from July 6<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> and is expected to draw close to 1.5 million attendees over the 10-day period to the grounds. In addition, the Stampede Parade will draw 250-300,000 attendees and tens of thousands will attend off site events.
- These events will be a large draw on CPS resources and have been identified as a Major Police Events.
- The purpose of this report is to provide a high-level overview of the policing plan for the events and answer any questions the CPC may have.
- We believe that we have the necessary planning, policies, tactics, and resources to ensure efficient and effective policing for these events.



# The Calgary Stampede 2023

## Stampede Parade – July 7<sup>th</sup>

- Our priority has been to work closely with the Calgary Stampede(CS) Incident Management Team and our other external partners to ensure the safety of patrons on and off the grounds.
- Our Major Event Management Section has analyzed previous trends for these type of events and are gathering intelligence to effectively ensure the safety of the public.
- This event will involve a dedicated Event Commander who will oversee coordination of resources in partnership with the City of Calgary.



# The Calgary Stampede 2023

## Stampede Dates: - July 6<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup>

- Calgary Stampede (CS) has their own security detail and will bring in external security companies for safety at the gates and to do bag checks
- CS supplements with pay duties (officers) for the Coca-Cola Stage, Stampede grounds, Grandstand, and an additional Public Safety Response Team
- Risk Mitigation: Licensed Tents (lessons learned from previous concerts/events)
- Collaborative: Coordinate with Community Standards (Bylaw), Transit Peace Officers, Corporate Security
- Engagement of the Diversity Unit and the Public Safety Compliance Team.



# Staffing & Deployment

- Ensure sufficient staffing capacity in District 1 across each shifts, during this summer peak period for leave.
- Approval for added Public Safety Response Teams
- Dayshifts for Community and Youth Services
- Violent Crime Suppression Team
- Bikes and Beats for peripheral locations
- Look at trends for areas with high volumes of Calls for Service
