CPC and Major Events

ISC: Protected A

Chief Neufeld has identified the 2025 G7 Summit as a Major Policing Event

Why it matters:

This will allow the CPC to ensure that the CPS

- Has necessary **policies** in place
- Can properly fulfill its **regular policing responsibilities**
- Has the resources to **police the Major Event**

The CPC can also help by

- Providing feedback and recommendations
- Providing advocacy and support
- Mitigating various pressures on the CPS



Potential for protests

Canada will be hosting the 2025 G7 Summit in Kananaskis Alberta, playing a leading role in advancing various domestic and international priorities.

Why it matters:

- The event puts the country and Calgary in the international spotlight, showcasing it as a key player on the global stage.
- Local ongoing protest groups may be drawn to this event
- It could attract national/international groups concerned about international issues
- It could attract security threats such as Cyber attacks

Funding and resource requirements^{ISC: Protected A}



CPS is in the process of finalizing funding costs, which will include:

- CPS Security Partners
- CPS overtime hours
- City Business Units
- Equipment and supports
- Buffer for contingency resourcing



Incident Command System

ISC: Protected A

- The RCMP Commissioner retains overall command and control over the G7 Summit security and operations, delegating authority through a structured chain to ensure effective coordination among multiple security partners. This will be managed using the Incident Command System (ICS), to clarify roles, responsibilities, and reporting lines.
- As the POJ, CPS retains command over all planning and operational matters within the City of Calgary. CPS will also manage planning and operations using ICS.
